John 1:41 -- ANDREW FOUND HIS BROTHER PETER AND SAID TO HIM, " WE HAVE FOUND THE MESSIAH."

Some things, like hard-boiled eggs, are tough to beat. And it's hard to beat the discovery that **Andrew** made. Perhaps, as we think about it, it may have been less a discovery and more along the lines of a recognition. It maybe that one day, after thinking about it or seeing Jesus, something clicked and Andrew perceived him in a different way.

The disciple Andrew might well have seen Jesus several times around town. He maybe have heard him lecture, or saw him work the crowd. Maybe Jesus even offered a friendly, "Shalom!" to him. But however it happened, one day Andrews eyes opened and he knew Jesus was no ordinary human.

We see in the text that this was the greatest "whoopie" day in Andrew's life. Hope of a new future possessed his soul as he ran to tell Peter, "**WE HAVE THE FOUND CHRIST.**"

Most People don't know that three centuries before that, Archimedes, the legendary Greek inventor and mathematician, supposedly yelled the same thing.

He shouted, "Eureka" when he discovered a way to determine the purity of gold. Eureka, which is Greek for "I have found it!" came to Archimedes' lips with transcendent joy.

In that same spirit, if we listen carefully, we can still hear the joyous ringing in Andrew's announcement broadcast to his brother. His words snapped like a bull-whip in their intensity as well as their **expectancy**. But had he really found all of the Christ? Of course not. There was much more to be learned about Jesus. He would grow larger than Andrew could ever imagine. So, in truth, Andrew really found little of the Jesus of the gospels.

Nonetheless, in some way, we too celebrate that discovery. Each of us have found Jesus, albeit differently. For some, when we needed Christ, he was a savior, for the others a friend, for the others a brother, for others the way, the truth, the life and for others God.

Might God bless each of us at the Bradley Memorial and Peckville United Methodist Churches on the eve of the

upcoming holidays -- as we, like Andrew, continue discovering Jesus the Christ.

A WORTHY JOURNEY,

Keynote address by **Bishop Jeremiah J.**

Park at the Susquehanna Annual

Conference June 2013

It was for such a time as this that God's people of the Susquehanna Conference gathered in our opening worship celebration on Thursday afternoon. Well over "A Thousand Tongues ..." joined in song as organ, bells, trumpet, and voice combined to proclaim the gospel. Powerful words and phrases filled the room as we called one another to worship, proclaiming grace, discernment, holy conferencing, and our journey of faith.

"A Worthy Journey" was the theme of Bishop Jeremiah J. Park's keynote address to the Annual Conference. Noting that the church must be in vital ministry, Bishop Park reminded the Conference that we are made for one another as he spoke of our journey as a life in Christ together on a journey of faith. One Christian, the bishop noted, is not a Christian, any more than one church is a church. Each church is part of a larger connection, he said.

"Our journey is worthy," Park said, "because it is a compelling journey. Those who have gone before us in this journey gave the best they had had to offer.

" Noting the many impressive and beautiful church sanctuaries he has been privileged to visit, Park said that they built as their statement that they were giving their best to God. It was their way of saying that their relationship with Jesus Christ was the center of their lives. If Jesus meant so much to them, he asked, why not to us?

Our journey is worthy, Park added, because God's presence makes the journey worthy. God's presence with God's people is guaranteed. This is the story of the Old Testament, the bishop said. The Old Testament is a witness to God's presence with God's people. Over and over, the Old Testament says to us, "Remember, remember, remember. Remember how I was with you all along."

We may be hard pressed, Park said, but we are not alone. God is with us. "I will be with you," Jesus said, "even unto the end of the age." Because Jesus lives, our journey is worth the taking.

Our journey is worthy, Park concluded, because it is a transforming journey. When Jesus sent his disciples into the world, he had the reign of the kingdom of God in his mind. Our journey is about God's kingdom for all people, Park said.

When I say "I am a Christian," I'm not claiming to be perfect. My flaws are far too visible, but God believes I am worth it.

When I say "I am a Christian," I still feel the sting of pain. I have my share of heartaches, so I call upon His name.

When I say "I am Christian," I'm not holier than Thou. I'm just a simple sinner who received God's good grace somehow.

Annual

Conference:

Each year in June, all clergy members and an equal number of lay members selected from the local churches attend their conference's Annual Conference session meet together to worship, fellowship, and conduct the business of the conference, which may last 3 or 4 days. During these sessions, members of the conference hear reports of past and ongoing work; adopt future goals, programs and budgets; ordain clergy members as deacons and elders. The bishop presides over these meetings.

The meetings called sessions are always held within the context of worship. This is to keep all participants mindful that we are not just conducting business, but are caretakers and witnesses to Christ's Church here on earth.

Annual Conference is the culmination of work done by various committees and individuals since the previous conference. A hefty package of reports, agenda, resolutions and nominations are received by Lay and Clergy members about 3 weeks before the annual conference dates. These items are considered and voted on during the days and evenings of conference.

As much as annual conference is for doing the needful business of the church it is also a time for renewal, learning, worship, and fellowship. There is something very moving and uplifting worshipping with 2,000 sisters and brothers. There are displays in one gymnasium from the many Boards and Agencies of the United Methodist Church that show our denomination's commitment a


